**This new policy has been drawn up following consultation with parents, pupils, staff and local residents. It is fully endorsed by Governors, local police and Surrey County Council road safety experts.**

This policy has been drawn up to ensure the safety of the children and adults in the school.

To minimise risk to all pupils as well as parents and teaching staff, parking on the school premises is allowed providing the following safety measures are strictly observed:

Drivers should:

- take extreme care by driving slowly (5mph maximum) and being watchful of children.
- adhere to normal highway rules (e.g. use of seatbelts and no use of mobile phones etc.) still apply

- follow the one way system at all times
- park only in marked bays, at whatever time of day
- ensure that all children are escorted across the car park at all times to ensure their safety under supervision of a responsible adult
- not make 3 point turns anywhere on the premises, particularly the drive, as this creates an extra hazard. Take extra care when reversing or when visibility is reduced
- be courteous to other drivers, and to parents and staff who may be on traffic supervision duty
- support the our Crossing Patrol person by being courteous and appropriately responding to her/his requests
- help to prevent gridlock on New Rd by not waiting on the main rd to turn right into the school entrance when a queue is already in place
- be considerate of our neighbours on New Road and do please help support their access to their homes. Do not block driveways or turn on private property
- Children embarking/disembarking from coaches are to use the pathways to access entrance gate. Coach drivers have a responsibility to ensure that they park so that children have direct access to the pathway without having to cross the carpark

#### Bikes:

- should not be ridden on the school premises- they should be walked through the carpark
- should be left securely in the bike shed
- Children are required to wear cycling helmets to and from school

#### During school times:

- children are to use pathways to access the front field
