

Sports Premium 2022-23



The government is providing funding each year to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport. The Sports Premium grant must be spent on improving the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of pupils so that they develop healthy lifestyles.

At Tillingbourne we recognise the importance of PE and sport in developing children’s health, well-being and positive attitudes. The information below demonstrates how we are using our £19,590 Sports Premium Grant to improve the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of pupils.

<p>To increase the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and raise the profile of sport across the school.</p>	<p>Tillingbourne will train 12 year six pupils as Sports Crew, 18 pupils from year 3, 4 and 5 as Sports Leaders and 40 pupils as Play Leaders and buy easily identifiable kit for them to wear. The Play Leaders are tasked with encouraging some of the more reluctant pupils to take part in more structured physical play at lunchtimes. The Sports Crew and Sports Leaders will help to run a variety of sporting activities for their peers. Every child will take part in Tillingbourne’s ‘Active House’ competitions and take part in regular activities led by the Sports Crew and Sports Leaders.</p> <p>Special needs teacher out at break and lunch times to develop constructive play. ELSA supports and trains play leaders.</p> <p>Active surrey – Physifit bag – clubs for least active – TA training + sports crew to run lunch time club.</p> <p>Funding participation in clubs (including regular swimming) for disadvantaged pupils or those with less opportunity to be regularly active.</p> <p>Increase girl’s participation in lunch time sports by arranging girl only football and basketball sessions.</p>	<p>The Sports Crew, Sports Leaders and Play Leaders will help to promote an inclusive attitude towards sport. The activities that are organised outside of PE lessons will support us meeting the government directive to ensure that every child is taking part in at least 30 minutes of physical activity at school daily.</p>	<p>£12,630</p>

<p>To increase the confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport</p>	<p>PE lead's continuous professional development, feeding into regular monitoring of PE teaching and the associated feedback/support for staff.</p> <p>Dance training – CPD for staff – Real dance Or refresh old scheme.</p> <p>SCITT students additional PE training to build understanding of the curriculum and level of skill.</p> <p>Hiring qualified sports coaches and PE specialists to work alongside teachers to enhance and extend current opportunities offered to pupils - teachers will learn from coaches the necessary skills to be able to teach these new sports and physical activities effectively through observation and joint working.</p>	<p>High quality PE being taught across the school will lead to better outcomes for the children. To increase participation in competitive sport

Tillingbourne will actively participate in a number of sporting fixtures, tournaments and external sporting opportunities. We will release teachers to take children to these events and cover transport costs when necessary.

We will develop and maintain our sports facilities to increase the number of tournaments and sporting fixtures that we host at the school including football and netball tournaments.

The school will run a series of inter house competitions which will include all children in a variety of sports.

Participation in district sports

Membership with active surrey – gateway to competitive sport

Increased participation in sporting events should lead to an increased percentage of children representing the school at a competitive level. By hosting more events at Tillingbourne, the number of children participating should increase and the profile of sport will be raised amongst the children.

Increased participation in sporting events increases the profile of sport amongst the children.

The inter house competitions will enable all 360 children to regularly compete in sporting activities, where inter school competitions are limited due to COVID-19 restrictions.
